Terms		Definitions
1	tolerance	A fair and objective attitude toward those whose opinions, practices, race, religion, nationality etc differ from one's own.
2	persuasion	Is the attempt to influence a person's beliefs, attitudes, intentions, motivations or behaviours.
3	perspective	A point of view or particular attitude towards something.
4	bystander	A person who is present at an event or incident but does not take part.
5	community	A group of people who live in the same place or have certain attitudes and interests in common.
6	resilience	The capacity to recover from difficulties or withstand misfortune, stress and catastrophe.
7	intimidate	To make timid or fearful.
8	isolation	The state of being in a place or situation that is separate from others.
9	social media	Social media is the collective of online communication channels dedicated to community-based input, interaction and collaboration.
10	empathy	Is the capacity to recognise emotions or perspectives that are being experienced by another person.
11	prejudice	An unfavourable opinion or feeling formed without knowledge, thought, experience or reason.
12	individualism	A social theory favouring the freedom of action for individuals over collective or state control.
13	democracy	A form of government or organisation in which people choose leaders by voting; a situation in which everyone is treated equally and has equal rights.
14	equality	The status of being equal, especially in status, rights or opportunities.
15	authority	The power or right to give orders, make decisions, enforce obedience or spread opinion.
16	perseverance	To continue despite difficulties, opposition or discouragement.
17	anarchy	A state or disorder due to absence, non-recognition of authority or other controlling systems.
18	egalitarian	Noun - A person who advocates or supports the principle of equality for all people. Adjective – Believing in the principle that all people are equal and deserve equal rights and opportunities
19	oppression	Prolonged cruel or unjust treatment or exercise of authority.
20	justice	Is a term used to show or express fairness, equity, rightness or the equal distribution of resources.
